

Evidence supporting full decriminalisation of sex work.

This is a collection of research from academics or respected organisations on documenting the harms of sex work criminalisation, SESTA-FOSTA and Nordic model implementation. Hopefully it might provide a handy resource for sex workers and their allies when needing to demonstrate and support their case.

Note: supporting decriminalisation of sex work in no way supports the decriminalisation of human trafficking. Further, supporting sex work decriminalisation does not necessarily equal positive support of sex work, one can remain against sex work but still want the best strategy to protect the people who do sex work. Decriminalisation objectively demonstrates an increase in safety and healthcare of sex workers and a reduction in stigma and police harassment.
